

SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES

JANUARY 1, 2022

The remaining members of the Township Committee Joseph Florio, Clifton People, Jr., Suzette Cavadas, and Michele Delisfort were virtual and Manuel Figueiredo in the Municipal Building, Friberger Park, Union, New Jersey, on Friday, January 1, 2022 at 12:01 P.M. for the purpose of effecting the re-organization of the Township Committee of the Township of Union, for the fiscal year 2022.

Eileen Birch, read the Sunshine Notice as follows:

"This is a special meeting of the Township Committee. Public Notice has been given, as required by the 'Open Public Meeting's Law'. A Resolution was adopted on November 23, 2021 designating this virtual meeting date and 12:00 P.M. as the time for this Special Virtual Meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Union in the County of Union.

Pursuant to the Resolution, a notice of this Special Meeting was posted, in accordance with the aforesaid 'Open Public Meeting's Law', in one public place reserved for the posting of Ordinances and official notices of the Township of Union, namely, on the bulletin board adjacent to the Township Clerk's Office. In addition thereto, a copy of said Resolution was immediately after adoption, forwarded to The Local Source and the Star Ledger. A copy of said Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Township."

After the Pledge of Allegiance Edess Damis sang the National Anthem.

Rev. Samuel M. Wright, Jr. gave the invocation.

Mrs. Birch then called the roll for the remaining members of the Township Committee:

Daniel Antonelli, Township attorney, administered the Oath of Office to newly re-elected Manuel Figueiredo.

Honorable Sybil Elias, J.M.C., administered the oath of office to Michele Delisfort.

Daniel Antonelli, Township Attorney, acknowledged donations to the Union Food Pantry that were received for Manuel Figueiredo, Michele Delisfort and Suzette Cavadas.

The Township Clerk requested a nomination for the Office of Chairman of the Township Committee for the year 2022.

Michele Delisfort moved the nomination of Manuel Figueiredo as Chairman, the motion was seconded by Suzette Cavadas, and carried.

The Chairman addressed the public, as follows:

Good afternoon. I hope you enjoyed the end of the year review video; it's always nice to reminisce about the wonderful things that happened during the year. Before I begin, I would like to wish a Happy New Year to our Township of Union Residents; Members of the Clergy; Elected officials; Friends and family; and everyone watching this virtual reorganization meeting from home.

I hope you were able to join us for our Winter Wonderland celebration here at Townhall. It was nice to see so many families, friends and visitors enjoying our downtown for the holidays.

I would also like to take a moment to thank my family for their constant support. My wife Rosa, my four children, my mom and brother and all my extended family and friends.

I thank each of my colleagues on the Township Committee. Thank you for your vote of confidence and faith in me. I am honored to serve as your Mayor.

I also want to thank the Township Committee for its leadership over the last several years, especially Michelle Delisfort over the last three years as Mayor. The fact that we can't be together to celebrate the start of the New Year reminds us that despite 22 months of fighting back the COVID 19 pandemic, we still have work to do.

Today, we are virtual and we will continue to stay virtual for the Township Committee meetings until it is safe to return in person. This is a good opportunity for me to urge all of you to get vaccinated, get your booster and flu shots, and continue wearing masks and social distance whenever possible. Together we can ensure that 2022 is a safe and healthy year for everyone.

I would be remiss if I didn't take a moment to acknowledge the efforts of our Union Health Department, our Health Officer Marconi Gapas, and the Union County Covid taskforce.

Throughout the year, they have tirelessly coordinated testing, messaging, outreach, and ultimately the administration of the vaccine and booster. The health department staff is knowledgeable, responsive, and a great resource to the Town administration, our residents, the County, and the State.

Our current Covid-19 numbers are: total confirmed cases - 9,712, estimated recoveries to date - 8,750 and total deaths – 95.

I ask that we remember and honor those loved ones that have passed away from Covid-19 with a moment of silence.

Thank you. In April we held a memorial for the victims and we heard so many heartbreaking stories of residents taken too soon from us. Later this Spring we will plant trees in commemoration of those residents lost to Covid.

As Mayor, I can assure you that the Township and our health partners are working together to help families get through this recent wave and come out stronger.

COVID RESILIENCY

Despite the challenges, we continue to build COVID resilience in support of the growth of our local businesses, with stimulus funds through the Township's American Rescue Plan Small Business Relief Grant Program, which currently has an 85.7% approval rate. To date, we have approved a total of \$890,000 to those businesses that have applied for the program. Congratulations and thanks to those who benefited from this program.

Through this grant program, we can continue to mobilize our share of federal recovery dollars to provide grants that will help our businesses continue to stay open and bring back their staff while rebuilding stronger.

STORM RESILIENCY

2021 was also a year in which we dealt with climate-related issues, such as the historic storm, Hurricane Ida, which disrupted our lives in vast and lasting ways.

Thank you to our unsung heroes, our first responders, and their collaborative efforts as they put their lives on the line to help and protect those in need. Their courage, strength, and bravery are admirable and recognized by the hundreds of people they rescued.

As storms continue to increase in severity and threaten our homes and property, we continue to work with our County, State and federal partners to reduce flooding, minimize storm related damage, and keep families safe.

As members of the Rahway River Mayors Council we are working to mitigate the regional flooding problem which will help reduce flooding locally. We are working with U.S. Sens. Cory Booker and Bob Menendez, along with Congressmen Tom Malinowski and Donald Payne Jr. to help secure funding and place pressure on the US Army Corp of Engineers to agree on a much needed solution, which affects 190,000 people in multiple municipalities and counties. We have pledged to be very vocal about our position and continue to strongly advocate for families that continue to be in harm's way.

INFRASTRUCTURE

As we continue to seek solutions to flooding, this year we will implement a GPS management system that will not only detail our sewer lines, street gutters, storm drains, culverts, and sump pump stations, but also record maintenance and improvements. The new management system will allow us to better maintain our infrastructure and have access to vital information in case of emergencies.

ROUTE 22 BRIDGE

Thanks in part goes out to our State Senator Joe Cryan, for his support of the \$40.8 million state-funded project to replace the existing bridges carrying Route 22 eastbound and Route 22 westbound over Route 82.

Additional improvements include: widening Route 22 to provide auxiliary lanes, streamlining ramp movements, sidewalk additions, utility upgrades, and new and improved directional signage.

An Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) with camera installations and a Digital Message Sign will also be installed, and an upgraded storm water drainage system will be constructed alleviating the closure of Route 22 during heavy rainstorms. The project is anticipated to be complete by winter 2023.

In 2022, we will aggressively continue our road improvement campaign project. The Township plans to resurface a total of 40 roads, and reconstruct 36 roads for a total of more than 10 miles.

PARKS

As we work on our infrastructure, we also continue to forge ahead with park and recreational improvement projects

This year we will: begin renovations at Rabkin with a new artificial turf field for soccer, football, and baseball. Weber, Pickleball area, installation of a Bank Shot basketball - Total mix non-exclusionary game where wheelchair athletes and able-bodied can play together with no disadvantages, Hoover, New playground equipment, expression swings that allow parents to swing with their child, Joe Collins, expanded and renovated walking trails, with the addition of 1 mile of nature trails, Volunteer, new exercise stations that are user friendly for seniors and those with limited mobility and Sichel Park new playground equipment and new rubber safety surface and wheelchair accessible playground slide.

TOWN-WIDE BIKE-SHARE PROGRAM

Expanding our recreational opportunities for families, we are excited to launch our town-wide bike share program this Spring. Our new initiative will provide our community with much-needed multi-modal transportation options that will reduce congestion and emissions while encouraging active and healthy lifestyles.

This "docked" bike-share program with a fleet of 60 bikes will have stations located at Anthony Russo Park, Volunteer Park, the Union Train Station, Lightning Brook County Park, and Joe Collins Park.

Keep an eye out for our launch date, which will be announced on social media.

NEW LIBRARY

As we build healthier bodies with all our recreational and physical activities, we will also help develop the mind.

We have begun plans for a new, state-of-the-art public library with the Township's first public Arts Center.

This new facility will have a larger footprint and will incorporate modern features to a classic design building. Some of the features will include: a new drop off and pickup area, new drive-thru book drop, large open stack and reading areas, art gallery, casual lounges, a business center, public computer areas, media/study areas, classrooms, activity and computer rooms, meeting spaces, a cafe, and a 150 seat black box theater / multi-purpose room

As you can see, this new space is intended to be an information and entertainment showpiece for the entire township.

While the much anticipated project takes place, our Vauxhall Branch remains open and our main library will be open to the public at an interim location on 1060 Stuyvesant Avenue, the previous home of the Family Dollar store. I encourage you to stop by and visit; you won't be disappointed.

The new library is just one of several new projects in our downtown Center.

Last year the Township purchased the former Union Theater, which will be dedicated to open space for residents and visitors.

The impressive Titan project, which features a rooftop space and event hall is scheduled to be completed later this year.

Centurion will continue with its third phase and has already begun demolition of the former Unity Bank. The bank moved to its new location in the recently opened Centurion location, which was fully leased only a few months after opening its doors.

Despite the ongoing pandemic and all the safety restrictions, our Center has been able to not only survive but thrive. We will continue to make smart growth and economically sound decisions for the Center business community and our residents as we navigate these trying times.

NEW SENIOR CITIZEN CENTER

I am also excited to announce that we officially open our new Senior Citizen Center at 652 Rahway Ave later this month (pending Covid restrictions).

The new location will feature: New offices, Health and wellness room, Quiet room for reading or just relaxing, Card room, Computer room, Large billiards hall, upgraded kitchen and a brand new meeting room for all the senior programs

The new location is centrally located and a short walk from Weber Park. We are looking forward to a grand opening as soon as we can safely do so. We want to make sure we keep our most treasured residents healthy and safe for the new year.

PUBLIC SAFETY

The health and safety of all our residents is always a priority. This year I want to focus on one aspect that has garnered a lot of attention, especially after people began to travel on the roads again.

Nationally, 2021 was one of the worst years for traffic safety. Locally we have experienced some of the same problems with accidents, speeding, aggressive drivers and general disregard for pedestrian safety.

Today I announce the start of our most aggressive public safety road initiative called, S.P.E.E.D 2022: Slowing vehicles, Protecting pedestrians, Engaging the Community Encouraging proper driving, Dedicating resources to saving lives.

The initiative includes new speed reading signs on our busiest streets, new pedestrian signage and crosswalk lines in our business center, and more focused enforcement throughout town. We will also partner with local organizations to begin an anti-speeding campaign to remind motorists to slow down.

I want to be clear, if you are speeding, driving aggressively, and putting people's lives in danger, you will be pulled over and get a ticket.

I am also pleased to announce that we will hire additional police officers this year to continue the great work of our dedicated Police department.

Our busy fire department attended to more than 5,500 incidents last year. Through the CARES Act Funding, we were able to purchase additional safety equipment, a Special Operations truck, a new ambulance and Engine #3, that is a water and foam pumper used for hazardous material and gasoline fires. This engine is part of the Union County Foam Task Force that responds to incidents such as gasoline tanker fires.

The Township Committee and I are committed to continuing to provide the best public safety programs for our businesses and residents.

FISCAL MANAGEMENT

All of these programs, initiatives, and services could not be possible without strong fiscal management principles and a balanced approach to finances. Our Administration is working on a balanced budget that will allow us to grow and prosper without over extending our finances. We currently enjoy a AA+ rating from S&P underscoring our ability to meet our financial commitments. In addition, through prudent and responsible fiscal management we have been able to stabilize taxes and offer our residents all the services they deserve.

We have also been able to capitalize on the increased house value trend. Throughout Union, people selling their homes have seen their homes sell for thousands above asking price. Homes sold have increased 17% over 2019 median prices. Buyers from near and far have paid top dollar to live in our thriving community. This is a testament to the hard work of our administration and all the departments that provide services.

When you have a vision, an execution plan, and a stable financial forecast the results are steady growth, prosperity and an increased quality of life value worthy of any investment.

2022 PLANS

We must continue to push forward and strive for greatness. In addition to our mentioned goals and initiatives for this year, we will work tirelessly as we look to: Continue our investment in public safety; Continued economic recovery for our businesses to ensure that they thrive and excel; Continue to provide our residents with accessibility to the COVID vaccine and testing; Continue the road reconstruction program;

I am hopeful for an exciting new year ahead filled with optimism, an end to the coronavirus, a return to normal activities in our community, and a robust economic recovery for our businesses.

As always, I encourage our residents to keep up with all things Union by downloading the Township of Union App, signing up for emergency or general notifications through our CodeRED notification system, via our uniontownship.com website, and by following our social media platforms @TwpUnionNJ.

Again, I thank you for tuning in and joining our meeting today. I wish you a very blessed, peaceful, healthy, and safe New Year.

We don't know what 2022 will bring us, but I can assure you that the State of the Township is strong. Our planning and management has placed us in the best possible position to weather any situation that may arise.

I'm optimistic that 2022 will be our best year yet.
